A New Song was inspired by and paired with J.S. Bach's Dramma per Musica, Geschwinde, ihr wirbelnden winde, BWV 201. We recorded this performance with Acis Productions, a Grammy-nominated classical music label. This recording enables us to qualify for a Grammy nomination in new music, early music, and compilation. Because of your support, the Consort was thrilled to restart its in-person *Bach to School* field trips for DC students in November 2022 after more than a 30-month hiatus.


