

After 3 virtual performances in the spring, **we returned larger than ever with twelve in-person performances!** We finished off our fall season with a triumphant performance at The Music Center at Strathmore in Bethesda, MD for the first time in 13 years.



Even though we have returned to in-person performances, our single ticket sales to date are down more than 30% this year as our patrons determine when they are comfortable returning.

MEMORABLE MOMENT

Our April 2021 concert was the first time our musicians performed together in-person since the beginning of the pandemic in 2020. It was such a fulfilling experience to create music together again after a long time apart.
