It might surprise you that there are many more people who listen to Bach's music today than there were in Bach's time!

































It was a very cheery house, and a very fine place to live.

for several weeks, just to hear more!


I walked miles and miles to hear the music that I loved.






I wrote music for many different instruments, too...

There are lots of other things a musician can play with. PITCH, for instance, is how high or low the music sounds.



The lowest pitch is the BASS singer.



Next lowest is the TENOR





The highest pitch is the SOPRANO












But of all techniques, COUNTERPOINT is my favorite! Imagine, if you will...





A TWISTY TURNY MUSIC JOURNEY


Bach used to walk many miles and travel long distances, just to hear the music that he loved.




