
# **2019 ANNUAL REVIEW**

► While many other classical music groups in the region are struggling financially or have even ceased to exist, the Consort has had steady growth over the last decade.



The J. Reilly Lewis Legacy Fund, the Consort's first separate fundraising campaign of its kind in our 42 year history, exceeded the goal of \$500,000 by \$67,552. \$567,552 RAISED \$500K GOAL

### **30 YEARS OF NOONTIME CANTATAS**



May 2019: The Mayor and Council of the District of Columbia recognized the 30th anniversary of the series, in particular the Consort's free Noontime Cantata Series. The program "enriches the quality of life" for D.C. residents who may be senior citizens with limited incomes, people who are homeless and suffering from food scarcity, business professionals, or those seeking refuge in the chapel.
